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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

During the first six months of 2026, Action For Humanity (AFH) delivered an integrated portfolio of humanitarian relief, early recovery and resilience-building interventions across Syria, Palestine, Yemen, Pakistan, Jordan, Sudan and Lebanon, within a wider organizational footprint that also includes the United Kingdom. More than one million vulnerable people were reached through programmes that addressed urgent needs while strengthening longer-term pathways to recovery and self-reliance.

The reporting period opened with winterization and emergency assistance, moved through substantial Ramadan and Eid responses, and increasingly shifted in the second quarter towards livelihoods, health systems strengthening, education, water infrastructure, disability inclusion and community resilience. This reflects a deliberate program direction: sustaining life-saving assistance while investing in the systems, capabilities and assets communities need to recover from crisis.

The first-half results demonstrate an organization able to operate across the humanitarian-development continuum: responding rapidly to immediate needs, sustaining essential services in protracted crises, and expanding recovery-focused programming where conditions allow. The second half of 2026 should consolidate this direction through stronger outcome measurement, clearer portfolio-level learning, continued investment in local partnerships, and disciplined attention to access, quality, safeguarding and accountability.

SECTOR PERFORMANCE

FOOD SECURITY AND CASH ASSISTANCE

Food security remained the largest area of intervention, reflecting the combined impact of conflict, displacement, inflation and declining household purchasing power.

AFH used hot meals, food baskets, vouchers, *Zakat, *Fitrana, multipurpose cash and seasonal distributions to respond flexibly to differing needs and market conditions.

Right holders reached: 107,000+



HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Health programming combined service delivery, maternal and reproductive healthcare, nutrition, immunization, disability-focused care, rehabilitation and specialized treatment.

Support to facilities and outreach services helped maintain access in settings where health systems were under severe pressure.

Right holders reached: 90,000+

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE

AFH combined emergency water provision with rehabilitation and construction of more sustainable water infrastructure.

This dual approach met urgent needs while restoring longer-term access.

Right holders reached: 379,000+



*Zakat: An obligatory annual charitable contribution (usually 2.5% of eligible wealth) paid by Muslims to support those in need and promote social justice.

*Fitrana (Zakat al-Fitr): A compulsory charity given before Eid al-Fitr on behalf of each family member to help people experiencing poverty celebrate Eid.

SECTOR PERFORMANCE

EDUCATION

Education programs sought to protect continuity of learning for children affected by conflict, displacement, and economic hardship, while integrating psychosocial and remedial support.

Right holders reached: 75,000+



LIVELIHOODS AND ECONOMIC RECOVERY

Livelihoods became a more prominent feature of the portfolio during the second quarter, signalling a move from repeated consumption support towards productive recovery and household income generation.

Right holders reached: 6,900+

PROTECTION, DISABILITY INCLUSION AND ORPHAN SUPPORT

Protection and inclusion programming addressed the needs of children, women, people with disabilities, orphaned children and other vulnerable groups.

These activities strengthened safety, participation, psychosocial wellbeing and social inclusion.

SYRIA

AFH's largest reported country portfolio combined extensive health, education, food security, WASH, livelihoods and protection programming. The program balanced immediate relief with investment in service systems and community infrastructure.



HEALTH AND NUTRITION

52,000+ consultations; 4,861 safe deliveries; 501 surgeries; 2,000+ children and mothers screened and treated for malnutrition.



EDUCATION

75,000+ children supported across 170+ schools.



WASH

Three water stations and multiple networks and facilities rehabilitated; 250 solar streetlights installed, benefiting 131,500+ people.



LIVELIHOODS AND PROTECTION

100 youth completed vocational training; 84 young people accessed apprenticeships; psychosocial, legal and child protection support continued.



PALESTINE

Despite extreme conflict, displacement and access constraints, AFH delivered food, water, cash, rehabilitation, psychosocial support and disability programming across Gaza, the West Bank and East Jerusalem.



HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Prosthetic fitting and rehabilitation expanded for conflict-affected amputees.



PROTECTION AND INCLUSION

420 children joined psychosocial and life-skills activities; inclusion activities supported children with disabilities



WASH

4,400+ m³ water delivered to 350,000+ people.



FOOD AND CASH

52,580 people received Ramadan hot meals; 14,783 received food baskets; 3,510 vouchers were distributed; orphan families and vulnerable households received cash support.



YEMEN



115,000+
PEOPLE REACHED

The Yemen portfolio continued emergency assistance while expanding sustainable recovery through health, water, livelihoods, education, orphan support and disability inclusion.



HEALTH AND NUTRITION

7,046 patients used Al-Anad Health Facility in June, with broader services covering primary care, reproductive health, immunisation, nutrition and specialised support.



OPRHAN SUPPORT

886 orphaned and vulnerable children supported; 652 received ongoing sponsorship.



WASH

Water systems improved access for 9,000+ people; fishermen, farmers and greenhouse initiatives received livelihoods support.



FOOD AND CASH

1,369+ food parcels, 2,990 Ramadan meals, cash support to 3,400+ people and Qurbani support to 4,480 people.



PAKISTAN

Pakistan's program emphasized resilience through climate-smart agriculture, water infrastructure, eye care, disability inclusion and seasonal assistance.



HEALTH AND NUTRITION

10,000+ students and teachers supported through eye-health services.

2,640+ people with disabilities received mobility support; Down Syndrome programming expanded.



WASH

15 solar wells, 52 hand pumps, eight reverse osmosis plants and one filtration plant supported 20,000+ people.

20 Farmer Field Schools; 300+ sessions; 5,600+ participants trained.



JORDAN



9,000+

Jordan supported refugees, vulnerable Jordanians and stranded Gazan families through cash, food, rental assistance, livelihoods and social inclusion.



FOOD AND CASH

3,030+ people received Zakat and Fitrana support; 2,390 received food parcels and hot meals



PROTECTION AND INCLUSION

Rentalsupport assisted Palestinian families facing housing insecurity; children and families participated in recreational, sports, and youth engagement activities.

300 vocational training project graduates; 15 micro-enterprise grants; 2nd phase launched for 490 participants.

The first half of 2026 reflected Action For Humanity's strategic transition from emergency assistance towards sustainable recovery and resilience. While lifesaving programs in food security, healthcare, and cash assistance remained essential, increasing investments in livelihoods, education, WASH infrastructure, disability inclusion, orphan support, and economic recovery demonstrate the organization's commitment to building long-term solutions alongside emergency response.

Across all country programs, the emphasis has increasingly shifted from supporting survival to strengthening self-reliance, resilience, and pathways towards sustainable recovery for communities affected by conflict, displacement, poverty, and crisis.





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
