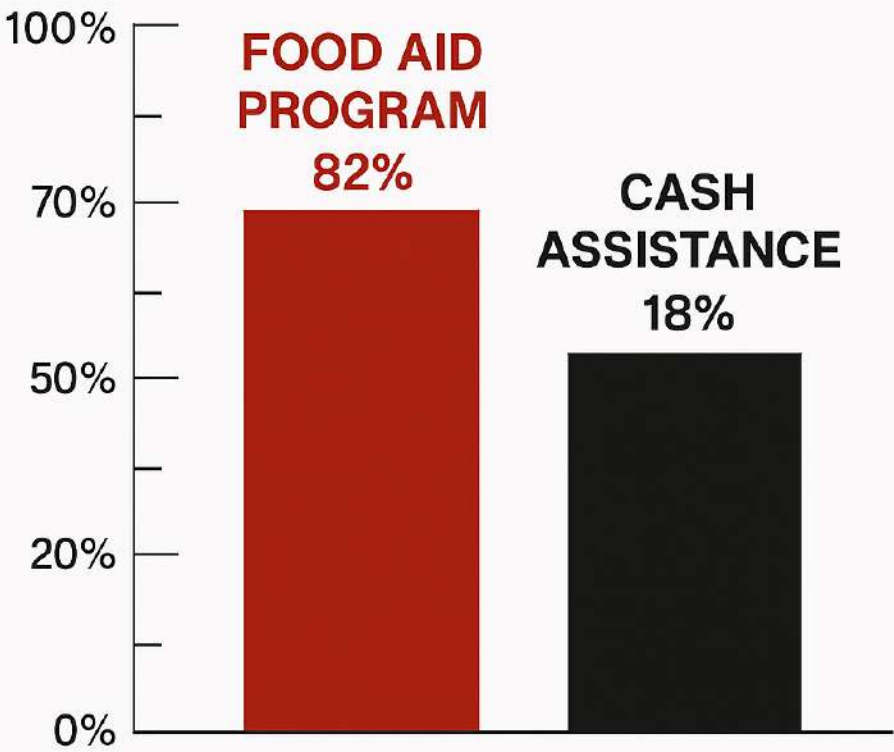
OVERVIEW

This report examines the transformative impact of our Ramadan Food Aid and Zakat Al-Fitr/Cash Assistance programs, which provided critical support to vulnerable families across seven countries; Syria, Palestine, Yemen, Lebanon, Jordan, Iraq and Pakistan, during the holy month of Ramadan. By addressing hunger and ensuring nourishment, these programs made a tangible difference in the lives of individuals and households, and this report explores the depth of that impact.

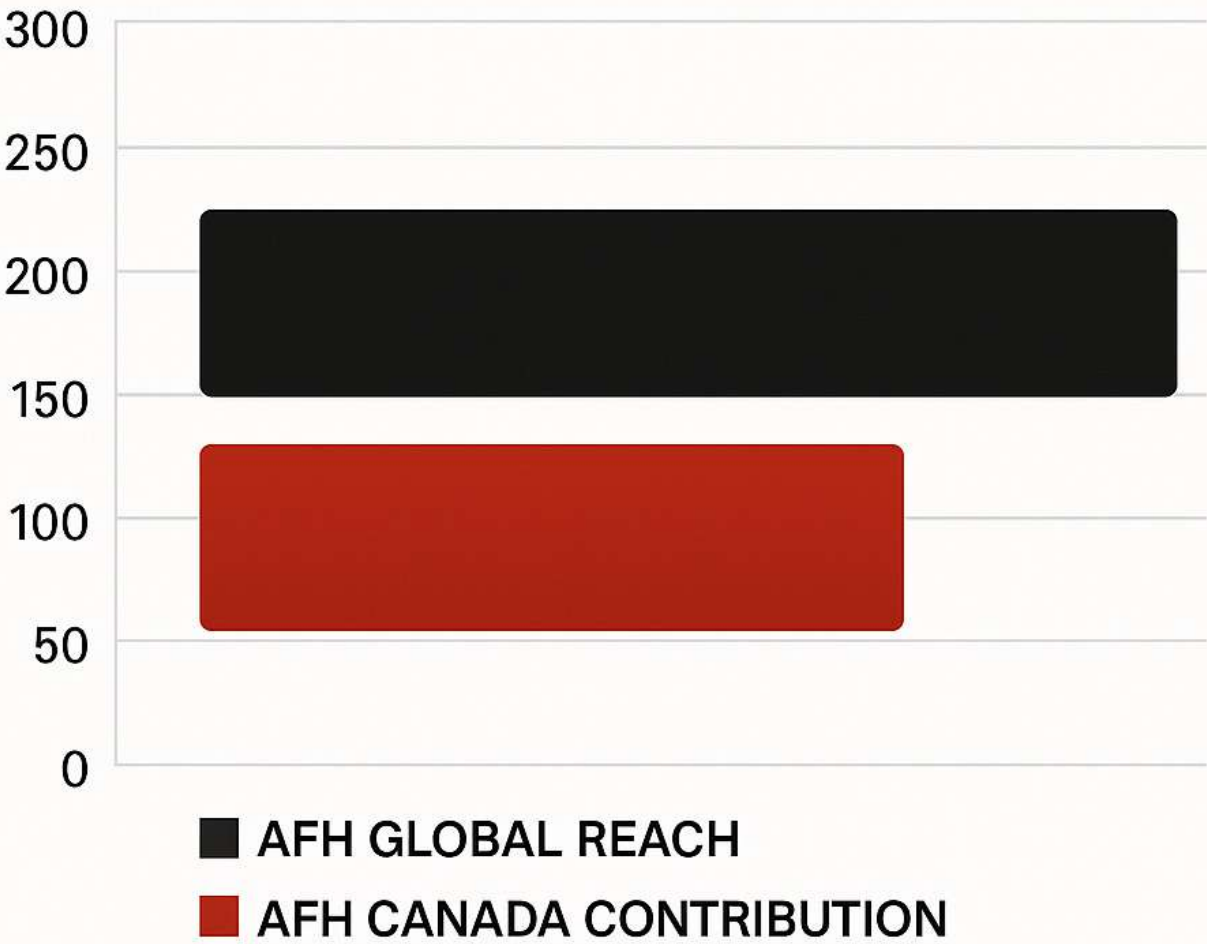

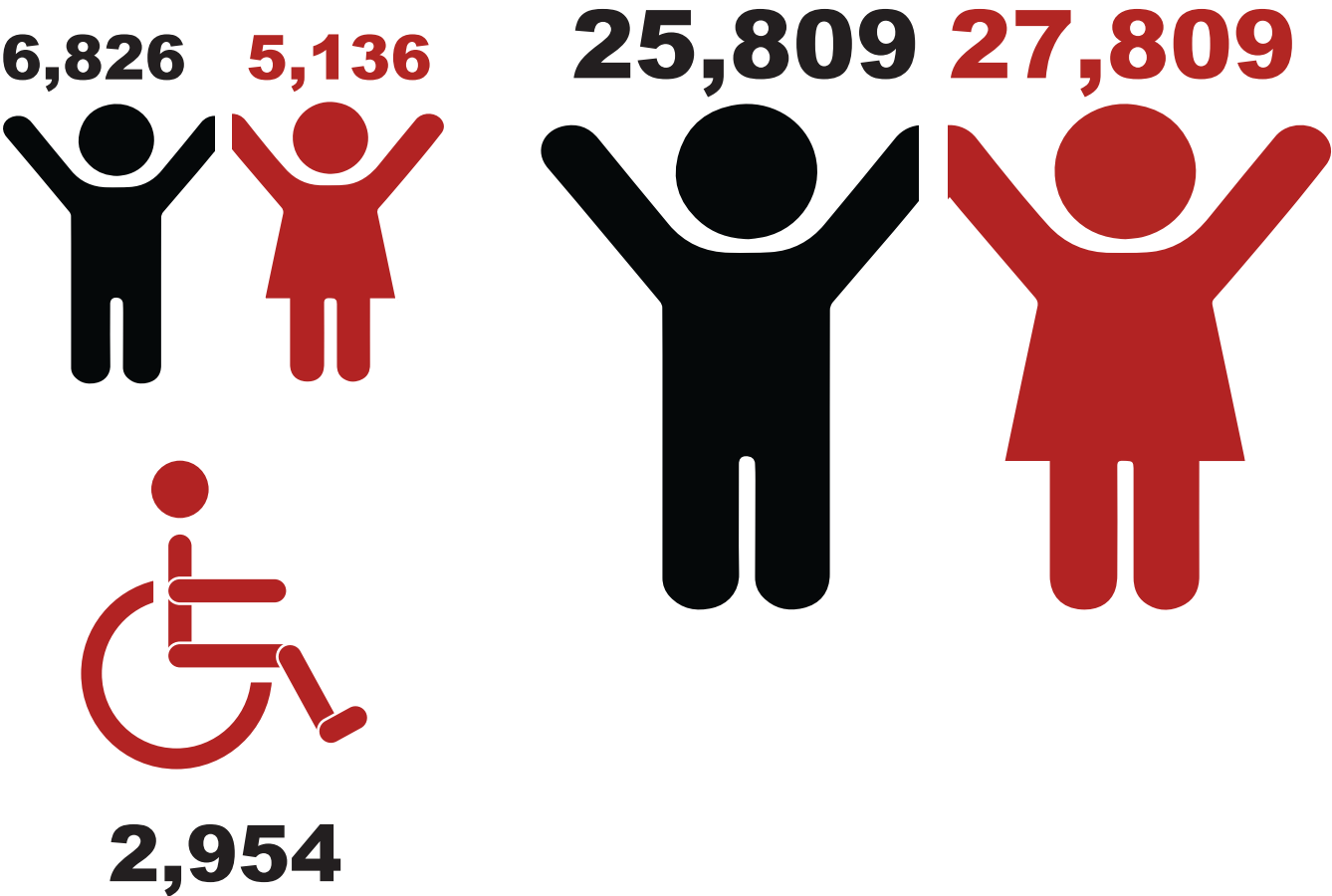


AFH GLOBAL REACH : 254,824 Persons

COUNTRY-WISE DISTRIBUTION

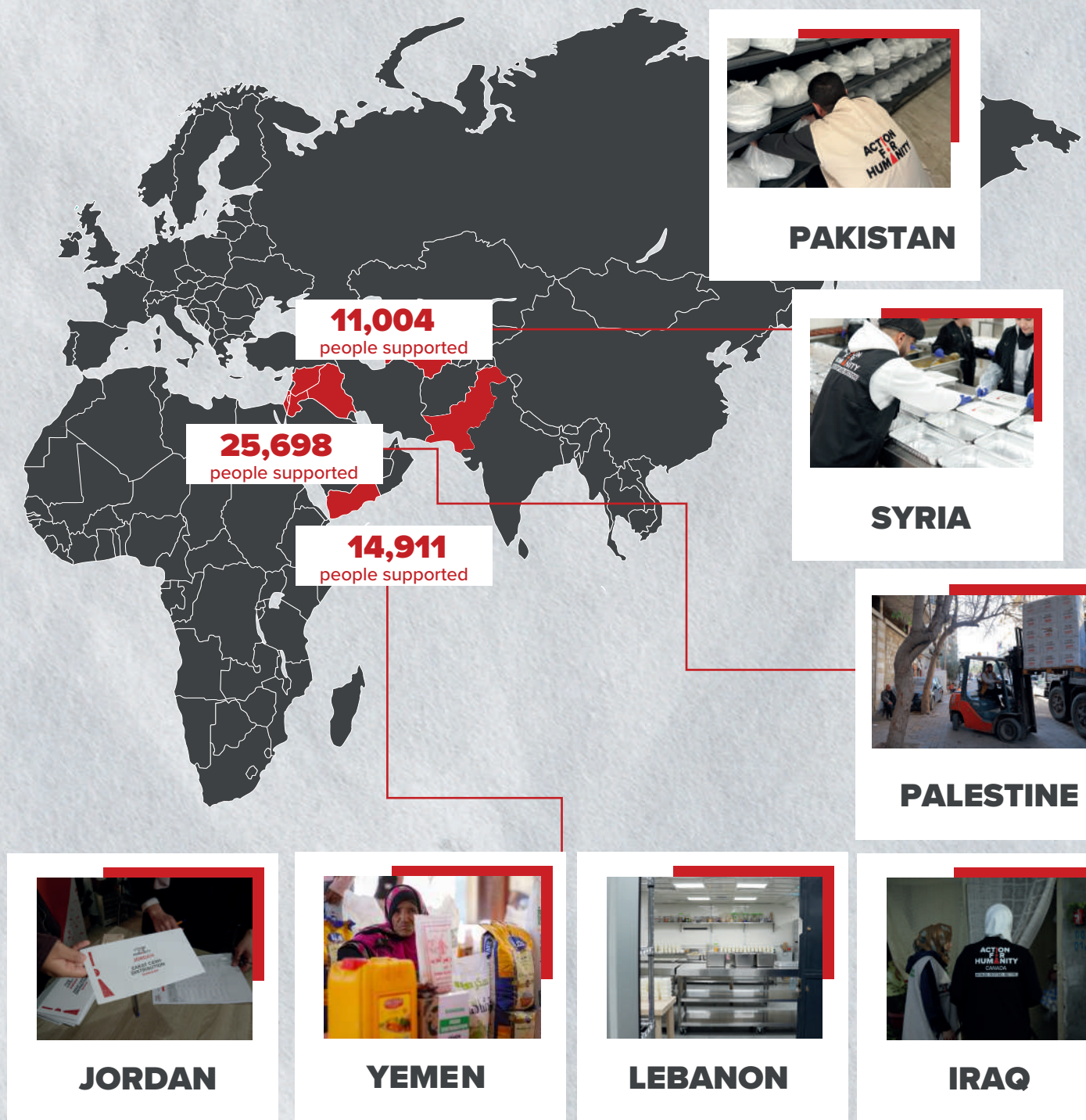
The need for humanitarian assistance and support in the mentioned countries, particularly in the Middle East region, is driven by various factors, including:



- Ongoing conflicts and displacement: countries like Syria, Yemen, and Palestine are experiencing prolonged conflicts, resulting in significant displacement of populations, loss of livelihoods, and damage to infrastructure.
- Humanitarian crises: the ongoing crises in these countries have led to a rise in humanitarian needs, including access to necessities like food, water, shelter, healthcare, and education.
- Regional instability: the Middle East region is characterized by ongoing instability, which exacerbates humanitarian needs and creates an environment where aid organizations like AFH can play a critical role in providing support.

1. PALESTINE: 25,698 (APPROXIMATELY 43% OF THE TOTAL)

2. YEMEN: 14,911 (APPROXIMATELY 25% OF THE TOTAL)

3. SYRIA: 11,004 (APPROXIMATELY 18% OF THE TOTAL)

A BLESSING IN THE BLOCKADE

In Gaza, where the iron grip of the blockade had squeezed the life out of families, Action for Humanity's Ramadan Food Aid program managed to slip through the cracks, bringing a lifeline o

For Mariam, a frail yet resilient mother, the arrival of the food pack was a miracle. A widow, living with five children, she had been struggling to make ends meet, but the pack's contents – rice, flour, oil, and more – promised a few precious weeks of sustenance. And Mariam, being the generous soul that she is, decided to share this blessing with two widows from the neighborhood, inviting them to join her for iftar.

As they sat together, breaking their fast with the food from the pack, Mariam's eyes shone with gratitude.

"In a time when it feels like all doors are closed, this food pack reminds us that there are still those who care, who see our struggles and are willing to help"

she said, her voice filled with emotion.

In that moment, the simple act of sharing a meal became a powerful statement of resilience, community, and hope in the face of overwhelming adversity.

f hope. Just before the blockade tightened its hold, AFH's trucks braved the obstacles, crossing the boundaries to deliver much-needed food packs to those struggling to survive.

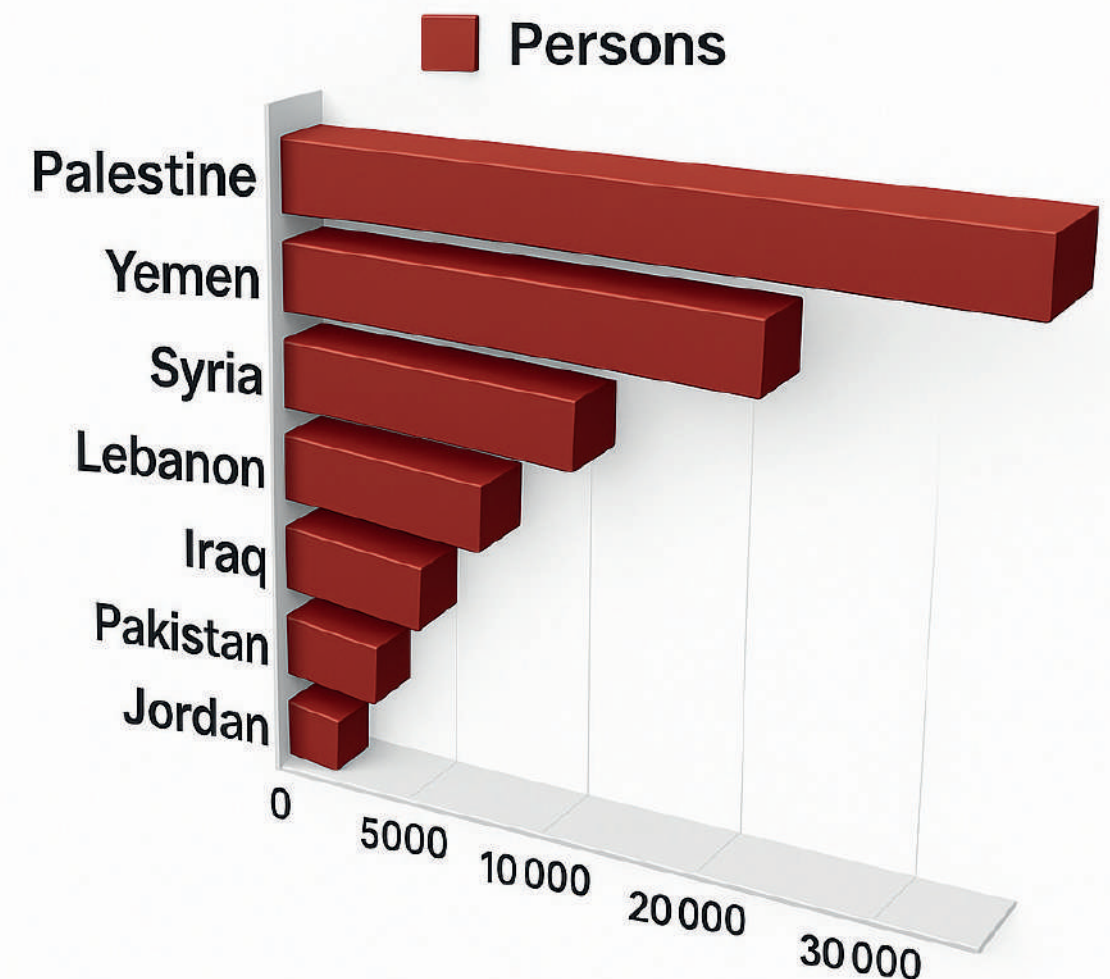

A WIDOW'S STRUGGLE

Safia Ib D.A, a widow, lives with her two children, in difficult circumstances. After her husband's sudden death on July 2024, Safia was left to care for her children alone, while four months pregnant. The family relies on assistance from a local Association and other charities, but their income is insufficient to cover basic needs, including healthcare and education. Her children require ongoing medical care for seizures, and Safia needs prenatal care. The family urgently needs financial support to meet their daily needs.

IMPACT OF AL-FITRA/CASH ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

COMMUNITY BUILDING : the program helps build a sense of community by fostering solidarity and compassion across multiple countries.

TIMELY AID : Aid distribution is completed on time, allowing families to have the support adhering to Sharia'a compliance.

DIVERSE BENEFICIARIES : The program benefits a wide range of individuals, including adult women, men, girls, boys, and people with disabilities (PwDs).

PERSEVERANCE IN DISPLACEMENT

DUHOK, IRAQ

In Duhok, Iraq, Ghazi MM, a displaced father of three, is navigating life under extreme hardship. Originally from Mosul, Ghazi was forced to flee with his family due to conflict. Today, they live in a modest rented home, struggling to meet their daily needs. Ghazi, formerly a blacksmith, became disabled after a workplace injury left him unable to walk properly. Adding to the family's challenges, one of his children suffers from severe epilepsy and requires constant care. During Ramadan, Action for Humanity provided Ghazi's family with vital support to help ease their burden. *"I truly appreciate this support from Action for Humanity. It has helped me and my family a lot in these difficult times. Financial assistance remains a major need for us to survive"* Ghazi shared. For displaced families like his, consistent support is essential to restore stability and maintain dignity through ongoing adversity.



A HEARTFELT STRUGGLE

RAQQA, SYRIA

In the city of Raqqa, Syria, Ibrahim Suleiman Khalil, a 58-year-old caregiver, struggles to provide for his sister Hala, who has leukemia. With limited resources, Ibrahim was forced to reduce his work and spend his time caring for her, often facing the heartbreaking choice between food and her life-saving treatments. During Ramadan, their hardships intensified, but Ibrahim received a food basket from Action for Humanity, offering a brief moment of relief. *"This will sustain us for a month"* he said, overwhelmed with gratitude. Despite this, Ibrahim's greatest concern remains securing treatment for his sister, who continues to fight against cancer in silence.



EASING A MOTHER'S BURDEN
